At the end of October the operating fund was \$117,582 in the black. In October we received \$12,942 toward the Building Fund. We were able to pay our mortgage of \$6,943 and an additional \$5,999. At the end of October, the remaining balance on our loan is \$415,562. Thank you for your continued faithfulness.

In November, the Operating Fund ended \$125,595 in the black for the year-to-date. The Building Fund received \$11,647 in November, and we were able to pay the mortgage payment of \$6,943 and an excess of \$5,428 toward our principal. We were also able to pay the Operating Fund back \$1,276 which was borrowed in August leaving a balance of \$406,705. We have reserves of \$46,168 which if applied toward the loan would reduce the balance owing to \$360,537. Thank you for your continued commitment and support of LPC through your giving, time, and talents.
