2. Make it a priority to Gather with Believers - I am being honest, many people go to church, when they have nothing else to do. And many people attend a small group, when they have time.

precious resources: time and money. Find a place to serve and be consistent, and give financially to the work of God.

4. Make it a priority to Share Joy - Many people spend a lot of time complaining, and miss the powerful opportunity to be an encourager or share something positive. A fun joke, a compliment, or a "have a nice day."

Jesus Christ was not typical, and as we grow to be imitators of Him, we are not typical either. As Christians, we are "Christ-like" or "Little Christ's." These four priorities are things I try to do, and they have served me well. Have a great day.

Missions Moment: "Sharing their lives, sharing the gospel"

Olive Tree Ministry

Marcos & Veronica Schultz have a multifaceted ministry in Baja, Mexico, which includes evangelism, ministering to youth, discipleship, mobilizing Latin Americans for missions, Bible teaching, and more. Their church in Porvenir currently has five families serving in missions and three involved in church planting.

"Marcos is a godly and compassionate man who lives life to the fullest and takes the opportunity to share humor and enjoy people," says our own Pastor Jon Hathorn, who has known Marcos since he started participating in Mexico mission trips in the 1980s. "He is passionate about living the gospel as well as sharing the gospel. He ministers in so many ways. He feeds the poor, speaks to children, has adopted young people and mentors people. He brings people along in ministry, he doesn't just do ministry. When churches come to Mexico to learn and experience missions, he wants to work together; the people from Porvenir Church work alongside. It is a beautiful mosaic. I know Lincoln will love him and love partnering with him."

Marcos quotes Psalm 65:5: "You faithfully answer our prayers with awesome deeds, O God our savior...." Whether it's sharing a drink of water and the good news about the Living Water—with a homeless drifter while out by the highway filming a Sunday sermon, helping to evacuate a family threatened by a drug cartel, teaching a theology class online, or comforting a family in the loss of their daughter, Marcos makes himself available to the opportunities God brings their way. "We have been in Mexico nearly 50 years," he says, "and God has been surprisingly willing to do His thing with us, through us, or in spite of us!" Pray for God's protection on their ministry and their church's missionaries (some of whom serve in a sensitive area).

Activity Center Capital Campaign Drawing to a Close



In May 2017, Lincoln began a capital campaign to raise money for the new Activity Center. At the start of the campaign, we received an amazing amount just over \$1.5 million in pledges which were to be paid over the next four years. This capital campaign will end on May 31, 2021. The total cost to design, develop and build the Activity Center was \$2.9 million. As of January 31, 2021, our outstanding loan balance is \$1.2 million. Thank you all

After Easter, Session will communicate and discuss with all of you how to pay off the remaining loan amount. In the meantime, we ask you to continue to honor your pledges. 
