inspecting a cake or a cooked entree.


At Lincoln, we are very interested in you

Matthew 28:19



Yesterday, I heard a quote given from a book called The Externally Focused Church. It said, "Evangelism needs to be our ulti-

mate motive, but not our ulterior motive." It usually doesn't feel good to be on the receiving end of an ulterior motive. It feels

cheap. Like the sale is more important than you.

Yet, what does it look like for Jesus to be our ultimate motive? Without a doubt, it requires some intentionality and involvement on our part. Our focus needs to be fixed on what Jesus has done for us. He has rescued us from hell! He has gone to the cross to pay for our sins so that

salvation might be freely available to all who receive this gift by faith in Him.

Make this known.

"Therefore go..." Ultimately, what could there possibly be that's more important to go to do?

We might think, "Jesus primarily meant this for missionaries, pastors, or traveling evangelists". But this is a command that is

intended for any who call Jesus their Lord. This is the mission God has given His Church. I can think of three quick examples of how this has been happening this past month at Lincoln.

Through the Food For You ministry, we have been going out into the neighborhood to build relationships and share the love of God through free gifts of food, dog food, and diapers. We are confident that God uses these tangible gifts as a message of His mercy, grace, and love. Having Jesus being known is our ultimate motive, but we don't feel the need to always "make the sale" when we are in the community. Simple acts of love and grace go a long way and we have no doubt the Holy Spirit is at work behind the scenes. It's

often the people we serve who bring up questions such as, "Where are you from? Why are you doing this?" We are happy to tell them that we are from Lincoln Presbyterian Church around the corner, and we are doing this because we want them to know that we love them and God does too.

At our life group leaders' lunch, we talked about the importance of God doing a work both in and through our life groups. We don't want these groups to be the ending place of God's blessings. We want to be true children of Abraham who God told, "I will bless you... and you will be a blessing to others." We are blessed to be a blessing. We discussed at the lunch how we might step out as groups to be a blessing.

Finally, I saw this last month at our community garage sale which took place in the Activity Center. I heard countless comments from community members that they felt so warmly welcomed, loved, and joyful to be at the event. I'm not sure if they could articulate what they were sensing or not, but I can. They were sensing God's presence working in and though His people. It was special to be part of it and I was thankful for this day in which we were able to raise about \$6,000 for local youth education all while being a blessing to the community.

"Therefore go..." Yes Jesus, because of all You have done for us and because of who You are... And may You always be our ultimate in everything we do.

In TeamKID this semester we have been focusing on some of the foundational practices of the Christian faith, wor-




We had an awesome Easter celebration this year! We enjoyed putting together our Kids in the Kitchen Easter edition for kids and families as well as providing fun and meaningful

Missions Moment - Over The Moon At What God Has Done

Did you know that Lincoln Pres is reaching out to people in Hungary? Through John and Kriszta Brouwer, we get to invest in spreading the gospel through training seminary students and pastors (John) and through presenting Christ-centered parenting seminars (Kriszta).

John and Kriszta love to mentor and disciple young Christian leaders and parents who in turn can influence others for Christ. Take Christopher, for example, a school chaplain and church planter who John is mentoring (online). Christopher is developing an innovative outreach/apologetics training program to teach pastors how to reach millennials with the gospel.

And then there is Simon, a seminary student who John mentored in regular conversations around the Brouwers' dining table.

Simon became a pastor, went on for his PhD, hoping to teach part-time while pastoring. God suddenly opened the door for Simon to become a full-time faculty member along with John at Karoli Gaspar University in Budapest. "Simon is Hungarian, speaks Hungarian, knows Hungarian culture, and is respected by faculty colleagues," John said. "He's young and will be around for decades to come. This is multiplication - 'organic multiplication.' I'm over the moon and still pinching myself if it's real."

God has opened surprising doors as well for Kriszta's parenting conferences, with one even being sponsored by a secular organization. "I felt so privileged to speak of our Father and the gospel to many non-Christians," she said. "Community leaders, principals and teachers were the main participants. By engaging with them, I was able to connect

with the communities they lead." Because of the pandemic, Kriszta had to move the parenting trainings online. Talk about "organic multiplication"! In-person workshops can usually accommodate 120-135 people. Online, closer to 300 people joined one live parenting conference, with a total of 2,500 views in just two weeks

after the event by Hungarian speakers from around Europe and even the US!

Kriszta recently videotaped sessions for an "Alpha course" style parenting seminar that w

enting seminar that will be used by the Baptist Church of Hungary throughout Hungary and surrounding countries. The Brouwers said: "Thank the Lord. [This was] not planned – definitely a 'God thing.' We never have dreamed of something like this."


