ovember and December - just 61 days but many things are involved. These two months are probably:

\*the most hectic \*the most expensive \*the most religious \*the most tiring \*the most exciting

\*the hardest without family
\*the most expressions of joy and thanks
\*the most difficult on our finances
\*the most memorable

I could go on and on about this, but the idea is the possibilities of Thanksgiving and Christmas. The heart and head balance of keeping perspective and not losing joy or gratitude for the meaning of the times that we celebrate.

I'd like to share something we have done the last couple of years that have been a blessing for us.

In preparation for Thanksgiving Day, I went to the store and purchased many gift cards to various places. I placed each one in an envelope and wrote something on the outside of the envelope. People chose an envelope based on what the statement was on the outside. It was a statement or prompt for sharing thanks:

 something I used to not be thankful for but am now
 something that was hard to go through but is something that has helped me learn gratitude

\*An elementary school teacher I am thankful for

\*Something that I am thankful for and hope other family members are thankful for as well

- \*A Thanksgiving memory that I am thankful for
- \*A family vacation that I am thankful for
- \*Two foods that I am thankful for
- \*A friend who I am thankful for

I think you get the idea. The more challenging and transparent the statement, the more the gift card was worth. Each person was asked to share for a minimum of 20 seconds (kids only needed 10 seconds). After sharing, the person got to open the envelope and reveal their gift card. This promoted some very creative and diverse sharing. We had a lot of fun with it.

In preparation for Christmas, we have always done two things - make sure it is about giving and not getting, and make sure it is about Jesus Christ. One of the things that we want to provide for you is an easy access to worship the Lord and make certain Christmas is about the Lord. Bev and I have always found that setting some finances aside for God's work is very special, and Volume 9, Issue 6

also giving to a couple of local Christian agencies is a blessing.

We have three Christmas Eve services to help with this:

- •4:30 is family friendly including a story for kids, a live band, a birthday cake for Jesus, as well as child care for the little ones. This service will also be live streamed and available to be viewed whenever you are available.
- •6:00 is another service that will be very similar to the 4:30 except there is no special story time, birthday cake or child care.
- •7:30 is our classic-reflective service which will involve less instruments during our music.

The joy of the Lord will be proclaimed, the Scriptures will be read, and we will point people to the Savior of the World, the Prince of Peace, the Wonderful Counselor, the Great I Am.

I am getting excited thinking about these things. Lastly, if you know someone who is going to be alone for either Thanksgiving or Christmas Day, please invite them to your home or pass the name on to me so we can connect them to a family for the day. Also, if you'd be interested in hosting a guest for either of these days, please let me know as well.

At the end of August we were \$148,187 in the black. We received \$15,835 toward the Building Fund. Our mortgage oayment was revised to \$6,946 per month from \$12,623. We also received the second guarter Employee Retention Credit in the amount of \$30,111.60 which

was applied to the mortgage. We were able to pay a total of \$45,946.60 toward our mortgage. This leaves a balance on the loan of \$1,000.332.88. Thank you for your continued generosity.

Through September of 2021, the Operating Fund ended \$144,419 in the black. At 75% of the year our income is at 77% and our expenditures are at 59%.

The Building Fund received \$25,833 in September and we paid the \$6,943 mortgage payment and an excess of \$18,890. Now that the mortgage payment is less, we reduced the amount held in reserve at LPC from \$40,000 to \$25,000, or approximately three months of mortgage payments. That excess reserve was also paid toward the mortgage. At the end of September we owe \$963,344 on our loan. It's exciting that it's less than \$1 million! Thank you for your continued commitment and support of LPC through your giving and your talents.

# Reaching Kids, Reaching Families

#### **The Center - Peniel Mission**

Bob Margaron pulled up in front of the Peniel Center, just as a guy walking his dog rounded the corner. "Do you remember me?" he asked. It was Memo, who had come to the Bible clubs and activities at Peniel when he was 12. It was definitely a God ordained moment. Twentythree years later Memo needed help. He had gotten caught up in the addiction cycle, and ended up on the wrong side of the law. "I shared my testimony and how much Christ loves him," Bob said, "we prayed and he accepted Christ into his life." Since Memo had two warrants for driving with a suspended license, Bob counseled him to get rid of the temptation to drive. Memo listened. A few days later he sold his car. He was coming to the Center daily, doing Bible study, getting discipled, talking and praying with Bob.

Bob challenged Memo to take care of the legal problems he had. In the meantime, Bob contacted Teen



Challenge and found an opening. God worked it out so Memo was allowed to attend the program at Teen Challenge instead of going to jail. He has now been at Teen Challenge for 6 months, and some



of you know him because you're writing him letters to encour-

#### age him!

It's through just this kind of personal discipleship and one-on-one intervention that God has used Bob and Lisa Margaron to bring His transforming love to kids in south Stockton at Peniel Mission for over 25 years. Even "kids" like Memo, who come back 23 years later seeking help.

About five years ago, a middle school girl who came to the center told Lisa that her family's power had been out for numerous days. The young girl's parent suffered mental health issues and was "selfmedicating" with

street drugs. The Margarons were able to connect the parent with some mental health intervention. The parent has been clean and sober now for almost 4 yrs. and this once broken family has been completely restored.

The girl who confided in Lisa is now a high achieving high school student, and her older brother just graduated with honors from college. All because one child set foot in Peniel, and the Margarons reached out to her and her family with Christ's love and some streetwise intervention.

Through our partnership with the Margarons and Peniel Mission, we at LPC have been able to participate in God's mission right here in our own hometown, by helping to pass out food to the community monthly as well as through our prayers and financial gifts.

Please pray that God will give Bob and Lisa wisdom as they re-evaluate at this stage of ministry what all they are doing (and how) and what changes, if any, He may want them to make. Pray too that God would provide more missionaries to join them. And pray for the future of this center that cares deeply for children, youth, and their families with the love of Christ—one
