### **Pastor Jon Hathorn**

When I was growing up, I was a part of a program in the summer, and the participants had all sorts of creative learning opportunities: leatherwork, tin engraving, knot tying, and we even learned to make fishing lures. I actually loved every one of these. I didn't understand what fishing lures were, because I had only ever used worms, peanut butter, bologna, and salmon eggs for fishing. I had never seen a colorful lure or a

spinner.

I remember the teacher explaining how a lure works. He said, you are attempting to have the color or shiny aspect of the lure "catch the eye of the fish" in hopes that "the fish will be fully focused on wanting the disguise" in the eventual hope of "finally wanting to eat the disguise" resulting in the fish "being hooked." Once the fish is hooked. the fish is soon to be "reeled in" and at that point as the fisherman you decide whether to "clean and eat the fish" or "release the



fish." Many fishermen are aiming for dinner.

The world in which we live has a similar battle. I really appreciate Pastor Dwight Williams and the ministry he has in our community. When he spoke at Lincoln recently, he started the message with some reminders of the difficult times in which we live, and the idea that there are many things that trouble the hearts of people. Here is the actual statement he made, "I fervently believe that the times we are living in right now, especially as people of faith as born again believers in Jesus Christ, I believe that we are in the midst of a full throttle cultural war. It's not looming, we are living in it."

Jesus calls us to "Love the Lord our God with all our heart, all our soul and all our mind" (Matthew 22:37). The disciples were Volume 10, Issue 5

called to follow Jesus and become fishers for the souls of men. We have been called "to be imitators of God as dearly loved children" (Ephesians 5:1), to be "the salt and light of the world "(Matthew 5), to "keep His commands and remain faithful to Jesus" (Revelation 14:12), to "do what Jesus commands" (John 15:14), to "walk in obedience to His commands" (2 John 1:6), and we are told in I John 2:15-17, "Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, love for the Father is not in them. For everything in the world—the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of lifecomes not from the Father but from the world. The world and its desires pass away, but whoever does the will of God lives forever."

The evil one is like that fishing lure. He attempts to deceive us and mislead us. He wants to distract us from truth and waver in our following of the Lord and being obedient to the

Lord. He uses all sorts of disguises, changes labels, makes promises that are empty, and simply lies. I really want to encourage two things for all of us: one, seek the truth of God and His Word by being a diligent student of the Scriptures - and secondly, be wise about the sources of information. As a church, we are committed to teaching and learning the Scriptures, which is why starting on Sunday October 2nd, we will have Sunday School for all ages focusing on Spiritual Growth and Discipleship. In regard to sources of information - I remember people saying things like, "I read it right there in print," and I remember my mom and dad saying, "just because it is in writing, doesn't make it true."

I wholeheartedly agree with Dwight, that there is a battle

raging in our society. Some of the things being attacked include: the biblical values of putting God first, the biblical responsibilities of parents, and the general authority of God's Word. I pray for each of us as individuals and for us as a church, that we would be faithful to Christ and obedient to the Word of God. God bless you all.

As we build up to the launch of Sunday School there are some exciting changes under way. The kid's ministry has begun to switch over to an electronic check in system and prior to Sunday School, each child will receive a name tag. A family can

During Sunday School time, there will be three classes available for kids. The Nursery for ages 0-3, the PreK class from potty trained 3-year -old through Kindergarten and the Elementary class for 1<sup>st</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> graders. The classes will be using the same curriculum called "Generations of Grace", through the year, which will take us through the Scriptures in chronological order.

After Sunday School has ended, the Nursery and Pre-K kids will stay in their rooms, while the 1<sup>st</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> graders will be picked up to enjoy the first part of the service. The kids will stay in the service a bit longer to enjoy worship and will be dismissed to Kids' Church after the morning prayer.

At the end of June the operating fund was \$86,689 in the black. In June we received \$8,839 toward the Building Fund. We were able to pay our mortgage of \$6,943 and an additional \$1,896 to pay down the principal Thank you for your continued faithfulness.

In July, the Operating Fund ended \$98,340 in the black for the year. The Building Fund received \$11,625 in July, and we were able to pay the mortgage payment of \$6,943 and an excess of \$4,682 toward our principal leaving a balance of \$441,545. Thank you for your continued commitment and support of LPC through your giving, time, and talents.


#### The Truth Project: An in-depth Christian Worldview Experience
